- The membership form has changed. If you intend to become a member this year please complete the top section as far as possible - we need to make sure our records are up-to-date, and the Croquet Association need to update details of coaches, referees etc. within the club. The car numbers are needed by the Silsoe Research institute for security purposes. If you have two cars just include the most likely one. Similarly, if you have two e-mail addresses give the one you would prefer to be used.

If you are not a member but still on our mailing list and wish to continue receiving the newsletter, please return the form with just your current address (and a phone number if you wish). No form, no newsletter.

- Every year at this time we send out a membership list. This is, in effect, the list of members from last year and is compiled by Eric Audsley. I have now put all the available information onto a crude but effective database which will be updated when we get your completed application forms. The database allows me to generate and update all manner of lists quite easily. There is, however, a problem in generating the list which is distributed to you. It is impossible to fit all the data fields from Eric's list across a single page. The question, therefore, is what information do you want on

your individual membership list? I can offer lists in two formats:

8 point landscape with address - Name, handicap, address, home phone, work phone, email. Landscape format (across the page) and in smaller 8 point type like this.

10 point portrait, no address - Name, handicap, home phone, work phone, email. Portrait format (down the page) and in 10 point type like this.

In other words, do you need each other's addresses? Please indicate which format you prefer on your application form - majority vote decides.

- **WE NEED MORE VOLUNTEERS TO HELP WITH TOURNAMENT CATERING** - if you can help please say so on the form. It doesn't matter if you can't specify particular dates. If you want to know what's involved, please call Judy Anderson (number on membership list).

- Full membership allows individuals to play when they like - they all have their own keys to the equipment shed. Group membership covers those who come down with the Leighton Buzzard and Silsoe groups and play as a group on particular evenings, one of the group having a key. If you are subscribing as a group member, fill in the form and send in your cheque individually. Don't forget to enter the club's Golf Croquet tournament!

- Information on Golf Croquet handicaps is enclosed. There will be a session for handicap setting on April 22 from 5pm onwards. If you cannot attend, need a Grading Score and are happy about the procedure you can do the exercise yourself in your own time. We hope to have supply of handicap cards available.

Secretary and Publicity

Officer's report

Nothing to report, apart from my annual request for contributions to the newsletter. We don't have a Letters Page or a gossip column, but we could.

Putting on a publicity hat, I am coming round to the minimalist view that in terms of publicising the club (a) most people have heard of croquet, (b) we have a continuing presence on obvious websites and (c) anyone who is sufficiently interested will discover the existence of the club through their own efforts. The rest follows.

We could, as a club, try and build a relationship with the local press, but this takes "persistent and sustained effort" (Liz Williams' phrase). I wonder whether it is worth it. The media aren't really interested - you only have to look at what happened at last year's Croquet World Championship. No coverage at all, as far as I could see.

So I'm not planning to do anything this year - in fact, I would suggest that the role of Publicity Officer be laid to rest. If the committee want to spend some money publicising an event or an Open Day, well and good, but this can be done by a group on an ad-hoc basis. The maintenance of existing links (as opposed to launching new initiatives) is part of the Secretary's normal duties and doesn't need yet another officer.

EACF/NT tournaments 2002

The East Anglian Croquet Federation, in conjunction with the National Trust, are staging their annual short croquet and golf croquet competitions at various NT properties over the summer. Entries are invited from CA clubs or other groups. The venues are

The entry forms will be available at the AGM. We have not shown much support for these events in the past, and it may have been because players felt that "someone in the club" would organise it. This won't happen, so if you want to enter as an individual or as a doubles pair either come to the AGM or let myself or Judy Anderson know you are interested and one of us will send you the details. It is a fun day out and a chance to meet players from other clubs in the Federation, and you get plenty of time to go round the houses and gardens.
