What the Victorians did for us



This photograph comes from an old family album and dates from the 1860s. The individuals are only recorded by their initials, and the woman on the right is probably Marianne Foster (my great-great-grandfather's sister's daughter). The man on the left is identified as GB and could either be Gerald Barrett, who she married in 1867, or (more likely) my great-grandfather's brother Geoffrey Bevington, who would also have been responsible for the photo and died at the age of 34 in 1872.

The setting is the garden of Geoffrey's parents' house in Wandsworth. Note the shape of the hoops, the peg (one of two in those days), the pepper-pot mallets, striped balls and the use of the foot.
