## Subscriptions for 2007

The proposed subscription rates for 2007 are as follows:

Full members	£41
Existing group members	£25
CA levy	£6.70
Under 16	£10
16-18 or full time student	£20

- From now on there will be no new group members. The fee for existing group members represents the first of two annual increases to bring the fee for existing group members up to the full member fee, so that in 2008 everyone will be paying the full rate.
- The CA levy is payable by all members (apart from junior members) unless they are already members of another CA registered club and pay the levy there. Note that if you are already a member of a CA affiliated club and then join a CA registered club you must pay the levy at the CA registered club
- The argument for a reduced fee for members who are already members of other clubs (either registered or affiliated) was discussed at the last committee meeting without any firm conclusions being drawn. It was felt that as the increase for 2007 is only the first stage the issue could be postponed.
- Future subscription rates may be affected by any changes to the club's plans for lawn maintenance and also by our licence arrangement with English Heritage, which is still being negotiated.
