Help out and get paid!

During the season we get occasional requests by various groups or other clubs to use the lawns, either in the evening or during the day. These events can only take place if club members are on hand to open up, look after the visitors and lock up afterwards. When the request comes in I can either accept it there and then, which creates a self-imposed obligation to do it myself if nobody else is available, or offer a provisional acceptance, cast around for volunteers and then confirm

the booking later on. It would be a great help if we had a pool of members who could be called on to help with such events. There is an incentive, as you would be paid £20 for your trouble. If the group pay in cash on the day then the £20 can be deducted at source, and if payment is made by cheque then you can submit a claim to the Treasurer. We will be raising the green fee for visiting groups to £5 a head to allow for this.

This arrangement only applies when looking after independent groups or clubs – if a member is bringing a group of friends or colleagues then that member would be responsible for the group and the normal green fee of £3.60 (or whatever is agreed for 2008) would apply.

If you are prepared to put your name forward for the pool please let me know, and we can arrange a quick training session so you know what needs to be done.

Working with schools

This is a new initiative which is very much at the planning stage. My original idea was that the club could run a one-day introduction to Association croquet during the summer half-term and follow this with a coaching course of some form during the summer holiday. The event would be advertised in local schools. This suggestion was circulated to the School Sports partnerships in Luton and Bedford.

In order for the club to be promoted in schools it has to achieve the Minimum Operating Standards Club Accreditation which requires, inter alia, the following:

- A member of the club (not necessarily the same one) to have attended the following workshops:
 - Good Practice and Child Protection
 - Equity in your Coaching
 - Appointed Persons First Aid in Sport
- Implementation of a Child Protection Policy
- Carrying out a risk assessment and establishing emergency procedures
- Having a designated Child Protection Officer
- Having codes of conduct for volunteers and rules for juniors
- Availability of a first aid kit and a telephone

This may sound a little daunting but most of it is reasonable and straightforward, and the forms for the various policies and codes are available. We were in any case considering getting a phone and replacing our ancient first aid kit. The major hurdle would be the courses, so I would be grateful for anyone who has already attended such a course to let me know, likewise if anyone would be prepared to attend one or more of the three. They are all being run locally in the next few months and you can find details on the Courses for Coaches, Volunteers and Teachers page at www.teambedsandluton.co.uk. The club would pay the course fees.

I have invited the Sports Officer from Team Beds and Luton to come over to Wrest Park to discuss the matter further; in the meantime I would be grateful for any comments or suggestions.
