CA News

- We put in a bid for the Selector's Weekend for 1999, but have since heard that this was unsuccessful. The event is to be held at Nottingham. Most of the 1999 events have been allocated to expected venues. The 1999 All England final is to be at Pendle, and the Junior Championships (which we had considered applying for) will be at Northampton.
- I have received a quantity of material from the CA which will be put in the CA section in the box file in the pavilion. The material includes:
 - club handbook details of the CA, grants, etc.
 - a copy of Bill Lamb's Principles of Handicapping
 - some CA logo stickers for use on correspondence
 - some handicap cards
 - the club copy of the March issue of the Gazette
 - 1998 Tournament Documentation (return, levy and result forms, guidance to tournament secretaries, merit award certificates, handicap report and rapid improver forms)
- You may or may not be aware that the CA send out the May issue of the Gazette to affiliates (i.e. members of the club who are not members of the CA). This is always an administrative nightmare and I have never been entirely sure what purpose it is designed to serve. Any member of the club who is a member of the CA receives a copy of the Gazette automatically, and we also receive a copy for the club, which is kept in the pavilion for anyone to read. On the assumption that all club members visit the pavilion often enough to read the club copy of the Gazette if they wish to do so, I have informed the CA that we do not need any extra copies for affiliates. I hope this meets with your approval if there are any affiliates who feel hard done by as a result please let me know.

National club competitions for 1998

We have received the draws for the national club competitions for 1998, which will be put up in the pavilion. Our first round opponents are as follows:

Inter Club: There are 12 entries. Wrest Park are not involved until round 2, to be played by 13 July. We play the winners of Northampton vs Sussex, if successful we are immediately through to the semi-final against either Surbiton, Ipswich or Nottingham.

Mary Rose: 13 entries. Our opponents in round 1, to be played by 1 June, are Northampton. If successful we then play either Surbiton or Letchworth.

Longman Cup: 35 entries. Our first opponents in round 2, to be played by 6 July, are Ipswich, to be followed by either Colworth or Norwich.

Publicity for 1998

We are listed on the BEDSERVE database run by the Bedford library service, who recently sent me a note asking for an update to our club entry. I discovered that they can distribute posters to libraries in Bedfordshire, so I have sent about 30 copies of a poster advertising the club (similar format to the ones used for last year's Open Days).
